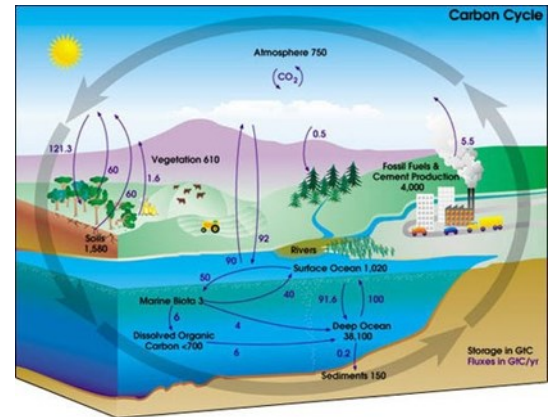


# A LEVEL GEOGRAPHY

A Level Geography brings a range of opportunities for students to enhance their knowledge and understanding of contemporary challenges facing the world today. A Level students will learn about prevalent global issues through topics such as Superpower Geographies and Energy Security, along with more traditional topics such as Globalisation and Tectonic Landscapes.



Geography is widely recognised as one of the most highly regarded subjects by employers, as students develop a wide range of skills, knowledge and understanding of our increasingly shrinking world. There are three exams.

- Unit 1 - 2 ½ hour exam - tectonic hazards, coastal landscapes, the water cycle and the carbon cycle
- Unit 2 –2 ½ hour exam - globalisation, superpower geographies, diverse places, migration and sovereignty
- Unit 3 - 1 hour 45 minute exam - synoptic paper based on all of the above topics
- Unit 4 - independent report. This is a piece of coursework submitted towards the end of Year 13, which will largely be based on a residential fieldtrip carried out during Year 12. It will be around 5000 words in length. There will be 5 lessons per week (X 50 minutes).
